A Brief History

Anderson, Alabama was founded in 1825 by Samuel Anderson and grew from a small farming community into a thriving town centered on agriculture, churches, and local businesses. Early settlers came from Tennessee, Virginia, North Carolina, and later Cullman County, Alabama.

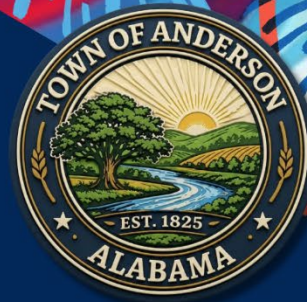
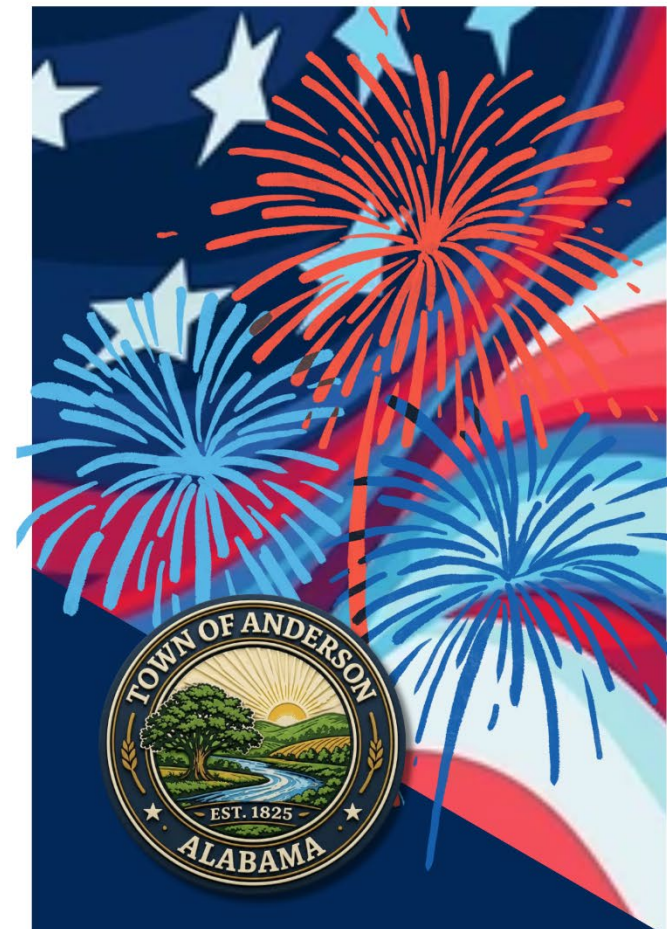

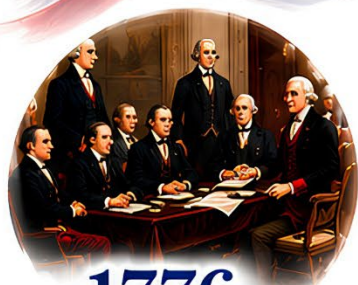

A NATION IS BORN

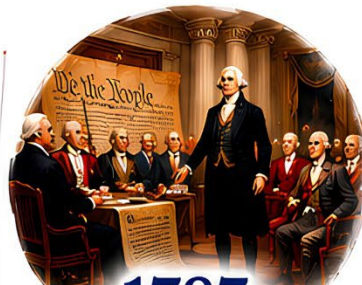
On July 4, 1776, America declares independence from British rule. The Founding Fathers envision a nation built on liberty, equality, and self-government.

THE FIGHT FOR FREEDOM

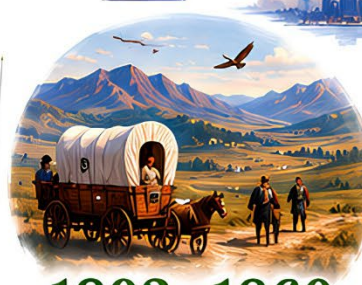
The American Revolution is fought for independence. In 1783, the Treaty of Paris recognizes the United States as a free and sovereign nation.
